ABOUT THE GUEST ARTIST



Marianne Gedigian joined the Shepherd School of Music at Rice University as professor of flute in fall 2023. She previously held the Butler Endowed Professorship in Flute and was a University Distinguished Teaching Professor at the University of Texas at Austin Butler School of Music.

Ms. Gedigian performed with the Boston Symphony Orchestra for more than a decade, including several seasons as acting principal flute. As principal flute with the Boston Pops Esplanade Orchestra and acting principal flute with the Boston Pops, she has performed on dozens of recordings with the Boston Symphony and Boston Pops Orchestras. She has also been heard on several of John Williams' movie scores, including *Saving Private Ryan* and *Schindler's List*.

In the 2000-2001 season, Ms. Gedigian was invited to perform as acting principal flute with the Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra. Her solo performances have taken her around the world, including recitals in Japan, Australia, China, Canada, Europe, and Armenia, and she has appeared as concerto soloist numerous times with the Boston Pops Orchestra and with the Armenian Philharmonic performing her own transcription for flute of the Khachaturian Violin Concerto.

During her years in Boston, she performed as principal flute with every major arts organization, including the Opera Company of Boston, Musica Viva, Boston Chamber Music Society, and as a member of Boston Ballet Orchestra. She was featured with flutist and vocalist Ian Anderson of Jethro Tull fame in performance at the Berklee College of Music in Boston.

Ms. Gedigian won first prize in the James Pappoutsakis Memorial Flute Competition and the National Flute Association's Young Artist Competition. She studied in Boston with Leone Buyse and Doriot Anthony Dwyer and in Michigan with Clement Barone and Donna Olkowski.

Michael Alampi is a multifaceted musician based in NYC. He holds a bachelor of music and LRAM Teaching Diploma from the Royal Academy of Music and a master's degree from Mannes School of Music. Mr. Alampi has played with many of the top regional orchestras in the east coast and has presented recitals and classes at the University of Arkansas Fort Smith, Stephen F. Austin State University, Monmouth Conservatory of Music, Yamaha Conservatory of Music, and Queens College Aaron Copland School of Music.

Meghan Bennett is music assistant professor of flute and director of woodwind studies at New York University. She was awarded top prizes in the SC Flute Society Young Artist Competition, Atlanta Flute Club Young Artist Competition, Flute Society of Kentucky Young Artist Competition, and Greater Philadelphia Flute Society Collegiate Young Artist Competition. Bennett competed in the NFA Young Artist Competition and the Fischoff Competition. She received degrees from the University of Texas at Austin, Peabody Conservatory, and University of South Carolina. Her primary teachers include Marianne Gedigian, Marina Piccinini and Jennifer Parker-Harley. www.meghanbennett.com

Hristina Blagoeva is adjunct professor of flute at Virginia State University. Recent New York City appearances have included a concert of Bulgarian music at Carnegie Hall (October 2022), a concert at Le Poisson Rouge celebrating Philip Glass, with the composer in attendance, and a performance of Joan Tower's *Rising* for flute and string quartet with the composer in attendance at Carnegie Hall. Blagoeva was the winner of first prizes for solo flute and chamber music in the 2017 Musical Fireworks in Baden-Württemberg International Music Competition in Germany.

Chris Boyadjiev studies with Jeffrey Khaner at Juilliard. He is a recipient of the ASCAP Foundation Michael Masser Scholarship Award and the Juilliard and J. & B. Wetter Scholarships. He is the winner of three concerto competitions and won first place in the 2021 Young Artist Competition of Beyond the Masterclass, the 2020 and 2021 Sacramento Flute Club Competition, the 2020 Floot Fire Soloist Competition, and the 2021 Pelican International Music Competition. Chris Boyadjiev will play his debut solo concert at Weill Recital Hall on May 22, 2024 and will attend the Aspen Music Festival this summer.

Pianist Eliza Ching has been an artist collaborator at the Shepherd School of Music at Rice University since 2010. She is also the Collaborative Piano Program coordinator and coach at the Aspen Music Festival and School during the summers. She has performed at Weill Recital Hall at Carnegie Hall and the Millennium Stage at the Kennedy Center. Ms. Ching was previously a staff collaborative pianist at the University of Texas in Austin, the North Carolina School of the Arts, and the Heifetz International Music Institute, where she also coached chamber music.

Ella (Dooeum) Cho, a native South Korean, started on her flute journey at age eight. She has won the Rising Star Competition and the City Philharmonic Orchestra Third Seoul Gwanak Competition in 2021. She achieved third place in the 2022 Sorial Competition. In 2022, Ella relocated to Boston, continuing her flute studies with Jinyoung Susanna Paik. In 2023, she won first place in the Miclot International Music Competition. She is a sixth grade student at Wellesley Middle School. Ella's artistic passions extend beyond music, as she takes delight in both drawing and playing the piano.

Ellie Choi, age 15, is a ninth grade student at Fort Lee High School in NJ. Ellie started the flute when she was in the seventh grade and was accepted into Juilliard's Pre-College Division in the ninth grade. She received the first chair for both Regional and Bergen

County Bands. Ellie was a finalist in the 2024 Juilliard Pre-College Concerto Competition and currently studies flute with Bart Feller.

Alfonso Cid is a flamenco singer and flute player whose mother and grandfather were his earliest influences. He has attended the activities of the Torres-Macarena Flamenco social club in Seville since 1987. Alfonso Cid studied solfège and flute at the Seville Music Conservatory. He was awarded two scholarships to study at the Cristina Heeren Foundation for Flamenco Art. Haruna Fukazawa is a flutist and improviser who studied classically at Mushashino Academia Musicae in Japan and jazz with Frank Wess in NYC. 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
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
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
