The 1986-87 Season

The October 26, 1986 Concert

will be presented by Ms. Linda Chesis. Linda Chesis was a recent recipient of a National Endowment for the Arts Solo Recitalist Grant; and was named by Musical America as a "Young Artist of 1982". Ms. Chesis studied with Jean-Pierre Rampal at the Paris Conservatory where she received First Prize in Flute, and the only American Prize winner at the Paris International Flute Competition. She has also won the first prize in the National Flute Association Competition in the United States. Ms. Chesis made her New York debut to a sold out Carnegie Recital Hall. She has been heard on the Metropolitan Museum Introduction Series, and as orchestral soloist with several major U.S. symphonies and was featured with Mr. Rampal in recital at Avery Fisher Hall in New York City. Ms. Chesis is an Affiliate Artist, Rotary Scholar, and is on the flute faculty at the Manhattan School of Music.

Ms. Chesis will be accompanied on piano by Shirley Irek, and James Kreger, cello.

Ms. Irek, piano, was born in Yugoslavia and educated at the Royal Conservatory in Toronto, the California Institute of the Arts, and The Juilliard School. She has firmly established a reputation as a leading collaborative pianist. Ms. Irek performs extensively as a duo pianist with her husband, Robert Chumbley, and recently returned from a tour to the Far East. Their New York debut was April, 1986.

Mr. Kreger, cello, first gained worldwide attention in 1974 when he became a top prize winner at the Tchaikovsky Competition in Moscow. He has been a solist at numerous festivals including, Casals, Marlboro, Ravinia, and Mostly Mozart. He received his Bachelor of Music and Masters degrees from The Juilliard School and is currently a member of the faculty.

The three artists appearing on the concert are also members of the larger Broyhill Chamber Ensemble, which is the heart of Appalachian Summer, a multi-disciplinary summer Arts Festival. Upcoming concerts will be in New York City, Lisbon, Cannes and Paris.
