NYFC PRESENTS: Robert Stallman in Recital -NY Premiere, Transcriptions & Traditional Repertoire -CAMI Hall November 21, 1993, 5:30PM

Join us on Sunday, November 21, 5:30PM at CAMI Hall for an eclectic recital featuring Robert Stallman with pianist David Buechner. The program will begin with the Piston Sonata and end with the showstopper Hungarian Pastoral Fantasy, Op 26 by Franz Doppler.

Very carefully woven into the program is a New York premiere of *Three Occasional Pieces* by Stephen Dodgson. Written for Stallman in 1990, the three works may be described as follows: the first is puckish and whimsical, the second is jazz-like with a touch of the blues, and the third is virtuosic. Dodgson has also written a flute concerto for Stallman which has been recorded with the Northern Sinfonia and will be released on Biddulph Records in December, 1993.

Furthermore, Mr. Stallman will feature two of his own transcriptions of 19th and 20th century music published by International. They are the Fauré Sonata in A Major (originally for violin) and the Mendelssohn Sonata in F Minor, Op 4. The sonata was written in 1823 when Mendelssohn was 14 years old.

In an interview with Stallman, he emphasized the substantial need for more serious repertoire for the flute, especially from the 19th century. He is always searching for works (mainly from the violin and cello repertoire) which may be suitable for the flute. It is important that these works possess a "character" that may be demonstrated well by the flute and can be done without too many changes.

He also states that transcribing is an

excellent way to increase one's ability to hear the musical work as a whole and to improve one's playing.

Of particular interest is Stallman's transcription of *Evocation of Slovakia* by Karel Husa for flute, viola and cello, published by Schott.

Stallman has numerous publications with International and many more to come such as: the Dvorak Sonatina and the Sarasate Zigeunerweisen "Gypsy Airs" in December of 1993. In 1994, a 2-volume Flute Workout Book will published along with a Bach Flute Book which includes 66 flute solos.

Robert Stallman and pianist David

Buechner have just released a recording entitled

"The American Flute" on the ASV records.
