ZEPHYR: Flutist Karl Kraber & String Trio to Feature New Repertoire

Have you ever been to a flute and string trio program and not heard a Mozart quartet? Well this could be a first. Come to CAMI Hall on Sunday, January 30 at 5:30PM to hear flutist Karl Kraber and his group ZEPHYR. The flute and string trio ensemble offer a refreshing program of new and different repertoire. Members of the string trio are violinist Browning Cramer, violist Joan Kalish; and cellist Michael Finckel.

The program will begin with one of four original piano works by Mozart arranged for flute and string trio by F.A. Hoffmeister. The original piano works are K533 and K494. Though the quartets were published and performed during Mozart's lifetime, they are not yet available in modern edition. Zephyr will be performing from the 18th-century edition.

The next work on the program will be two Chorale Preludes of J.S. Bach originally for organ, transcribed by Kraber. This will be followed by *Quartetto* by Mario Davidovsky, which was written for and premiered at the 1987 NFA Convention. Kraber says the work has tremendous dynamics and is "...very thorny and exciting to play."

After intermission, the group will play the Quartet in C Major, Op. 20 by Ignaz Pleyel. The last piece on the program, Serenade, composed by Flemish composer Paul DeWailly (a student of Cesar Franck) was written in 1899 and sounds very much like early Ravel.

Zephyr was founded in 1987 and has played on numerous occasions in NY state and NYC.

Exhibits by flute makers, music publishers, etc. will be open from 9:00 to 5:00. This will be an ideal opportunity to try out new instruments and look over newly-published music and recordings. Throughout the day, there will be numerous activities such as the NYFC competition, workshops, flute choir sessions and an evening concert. Programs will include: Keith Underwood, masterclass on breathing; Sandra Miller, chronological tour of Baroque flutes; Nancy Toff, lecture on Theobald Boehm commorating the 200th anniversary of his birth and Bart Feller, masterclass on playing in an orchestral flute section.

This year for the first time the competition will be open to the public and will part of the Flute Fair.
